Oedipus Lesson 6 – Discussion/Study Questions

Read *Oedipus the King*, from "Is this something Creon has devised" through "I do not care, if I have saved the city" (lines 454–535).

- 1. Of what is Oedipus accusing Teiresias?
- 2. How does the re-emergence of the story of the Sphinx support your understanding of how Oedipus feels about prophecy?
- 3. What is the cumulative impact of the word *will* on the meaning Teiresias's reply? What is the effect of the repetition of *will*?
- 4. How does Teiresias's prophecy play into the structural distinction between the *plot* of the play (the actions and events that occur on the stage) and *story* (the totality of actions and events both as they are related and as they occur) that you explored in Lesson 3?
- 5. How does Teiresias's reference to time shape your understanding of the structure of this drama?
- 6. How does Oedipus's approach to solving the mystery of Laius's murder compare to how he approached the mystery of the Sphinx?
