Inequality Stories



You have seen that certain real-world situations can be described using inequalities. For example, in *How Many of Each Kind* each dozen plain cookies uses 1 pound of cookie dough and each dozen iced cookies uses 0.7 pounds of cookie dough, but the Woos have only 110 pounds of cookie dough. This limitation can be described by the inequality , where *P* is the number of dozens of plan cookies and *i* is the number of dozens of iced cookies.

In this assignment, you will look further at the relationship between real-world situations and inequalities.
