- 2. How does the word *breed* impact the tone of sentence?
- 3. How does Du Bois describe "prejudice" in this sentence? What is the impact of this description?
- 4. How does the description of "the four winds" contribute to the tone of the excerpt?
- 5. Who are "the dark hosts"?
- 6. How does Du Bois's description of African Americans as "diseased and dying" further develop the idea of prejudice?
- 7. What does Du Bois mean by the phrase "our voting is in vain"?
- 8. What is the effect of the rhetorical questions beginning "what need of" in this passage?

- 9. How does Du Bois's idea of the "half-men" further develop the relationship between "the Nation" and "the dark hosts"?
- 10. According to Du Bois, who is responsible for "the suicide of a race"?
- 11. What tone does Du Bois create through his word choice and use of rhetoric in paragraph 11?
- 12. What is the impact of the last sentence on the meaning of the rest of the paragraph?
