

CHILDREN age 6-14:


Classes afternoons and weekends in creative drama, acting, dance, and mime. Classes culminate in a presentation to friends and family.

THE TEEN COMPANY

Youth Theatre Unlimited produces each year a Teen Company production directed by professional director, Clay Stevenson. The past two years productions "Antigone" by Sophoacles and "David & Lisa" by James Reach have opened at The Old Place in downtown Hartford, then toured to area high schools. Auditions for the company are open to all area teenagers.



HISTORY

Youth Theatre Unlimited was founded in 1973 by a group of artists dedicated to the development of quality arts programming for young people. For ten years Y.T.U. has sent artists into the Hartford area schools to share their talents with educators and students. In 1981, Youth Theatre Unlimited opened its doors to the public offering classes and performance opportunities to children, teens, and adults.

THE PERFORMERS WORKSHOP

Youth Theatre Unlimited's adult training and performance component offers:

CLASSES — Evenings and weekends in acting technique, scene study, dance, and voice. Classes culminate in an end of semester presentation.

PERFORMANCES — Members of the advanced acting class may audition to become a member of the **Performers Workshop Ensemble**. The Performers Workshop produced its first major show in January of 1983, "The Sign in Sidney Brustein's Window" by Lorraine Hansberry. T.P.W. ensemble members also played the adult roles in the Teen Company productions.
